Her specialism in medieval archaeology led her to develop projects investigating the origins of medieval settlements in East Anglia by excavating test pits in villages. These have given over 10,000 young people the opportunity to participate. More recently Carenza has been advising the 'Small Pits, Big Ideas' project, run by Worcestershire Archaeological Society and the Worcestershire Archive and Archaeology Service.
